# 32

Confession the Faith *Westminster Shorter Catechism, Questions 77, 78, 79*

**Q 77 The Elder:** Wherein do justification and sanctification differ?

**A 77 The Congregation:** Although sanctification be inseparably joined with justification, yet they differ, in that God in justification imputeth the righteousness of Christ; in sanctification his Spirit infuseth grace, and enableth to the exercise thereof; in the former, sin is pardoned; in the other, it is subdued the one doth equally free all believers from the revenging wrath of God, and that perfectly in this life, that they never fall into condemnation; the other is neither equal in all, nor in this life perfect in any, but growing up to perfection.

**Q 78 The Elder:** Whence ariseth the imperfection of sanctification in believers?

**A 78 The Congregation:** The imperfection of sanctification in believers ariseth from the remnants of sin abiding in every part of them, and the perpetual lustings of the flesh against the spirit; whereby they are often foiled with temptations, and fall into many sins,] are hindered in all their spiritual services, and their best works are imperfect and defiled in the sight of God.

**Q 79 The Elder:** May not true believers, by reason of their imperfections, and the many temptations and sins they are overtaken with, fall away from the state of grace?

**A 79 The Congregation:** True believers, by reason of the unchangeable love of God, and his decree and covenant to give them perseverance, their inseparable union with Christ, his continual intercession for them, and the Spirit and seed of God abiding in them, can neither totally nor finally fall away from the state of grace, but are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation.

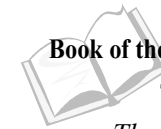

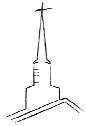

Communicating Like a Christian

Introduction: Holiness is not the way to Christ, but Christ is the way to holiness.

Thesis: As we “Learn Christ” we find the way of holiness in relationships with others.

Text Notes:

1. A holy life should be a life of speaking the truth (Verse 25)
2. A holy life should be a life of controlling our anger (Verse 26)
3. In these things, we seek to avoid giving the Devil a base of operations (Verse 27)

Conclusion: To be in step with the world means to be out of step with Christ.
