Reflection

Westminster Confession of Faith Chapter XXI
Of Religious Worship, and the Sabbath Day, V - VI

V. The reading of the Scriptures with godly fear, the sound preaching and conscionable hearing of the Word, in obedience unto God, with understanding, faith and reverence, singing of psalms with grace in the heart; as also, the due administration and worthy receiving of the sacraments instituted by Christ, are all parts of the ordinary religious worship of God: beside religious oaths, vows, solemn fastings, and thanksgivings upon special occasions, which are, in their several times and seasons, to be used in an holy and religious manner.

VI. Neither prayer, nor any other part of religious worship, is now, under the Gospel, either tied unto, or made more acceptable by any place in which it is performed, or towards which it is directed: but God is to be worshipped everywhere, in spirit and truth; as, in private families daily, and in secret, each one by himself; so, more solemnly in the public assemblies, which are not carelessly or willfully to be neglected, or forsaken, when God, by His Word or providence, calls thereunto.

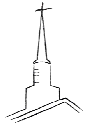
John provides vivid lessons and instructions from Jesus Christ on how to live according to God's will and what priorities are important to life.

Introduction: a Hebrew proverb tells us, “Put something where you can see it so your eye will remind your heart.”

Thesis: Our heart is to be constantly set upon an attitude of worship and praise.

Text Notes:

First, Your inner focus should be upon God’s goodness. (Verse 16-18)

Secondly, Your outward focus should be a grateful reception of the means of grace. (Verse 19-21)

Third, Your overarching focus should be the blessing of heavenly holiness. (verses 23-24)
