Mission to North America

Disaster Response - Haiti Earthquake Relief.

When disaster strikes, MNA ShortTerm Missions and Disaster Response coordinates the PCA message of God's love to those affected. MNA Disaster Response is in contact with PCA pastors and church planting team members working in Haiti where a 7.0 earthquake struck near Port-au-Prince. Leaders are assessing damage now to determine how MNA can best serve the PCA in response, including strategies to assist those in desperate need. We will provide new information as soon as it is available.

For now, you can:

- Pray that God will provide the assessment team with strengthened faith and opportunities to serve fellow believers; pray also for God's people as they serve others in the affected areas, demonstrating the Gospel through acts of mercy. "Pray.....that our service in Jerusalem may be acceptable to the saints there...." Romans 15:31
- Prayerfully consider a financial contribution. Gifts will be used to meet the needs of mission churches there who are affected, and to provide resources for God's people to serve others in the community. **CRPC deacons will be collecting a special offering today for Haiti earthquake relief. The monies will go to MNA Disaster Response - Haiti Earthquake Relief. We also will accept designated Haiti relief for the last two Sundays in January and the deacons will match the giving from deacon's fund.**
- We do not know at this time how soon volunteer assistance will be permitted by local authorities; if you would like to volunteer in the future, please register your team online.

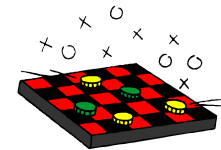

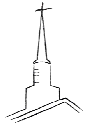
