Policy Regarding Special Worship Participation

1. CRPC aims to be faithful in maintaining the authority of the Word of God over our faith, worship, and practice (I Cor 14: 33 & 40; Col 2:5; Titus 1:5).
2. CRPC takes seriously the Bible's teaching regarding worship and the preaching of the Word. We will reserve the pulpit for the leading of worship and preaching of the Word. We ask that those who have not been ordained in the PCA or another conservative reformed church and have reports, extra announcements, or some other need to address the congregation, to speak from the podium rather than the pulpit. Also, we would ask those who address the congregation from the podium keep in mind they should not attempt to preach or lead the congregation in worship and prayer. (Titus 2:1; I Tim 1:3-4; 2 Tim 1:13).
3. We take seriously the Bible when it says, "I do not permit a woman to teach or to exercise authority over a man; rather, she is to remain quiet. (1 Timothy 2:12)." Although there are differences of opinion about the extent of the application of the Bible's teaching regarding the role of women, we do affirm that care should be taken that women not attempt to instruct or teach during worship service or in Bible study when there are both men and women present (I Cor 14:34-35 I Timothy 2:12).
4. We do not find a clear warrant in Scripture for women filling a church office (elders or deacons) (I Tim 3:2, 12; Acts 6:3).
5. Persons participating in worship activities (such as singing in the choir, playing an instrument, reading the Scriptures, giving a testimony, giving a teaching, etc.) should be a member of the church or be officially approved by the Session (I Cor 12:12; Eph 4:12 & 16; Col 3:5).

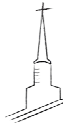

I Believe He was Crucified
Mark 15:22-39

Introduction: Learn to know Christ and him crucified. Learn to sing to him, and say, "Lord Jesus, you are my righteousness, I am your sin. You have taken upon yourself what is mine and given me what is yours. You have become what you were not so that I might become what I was not." --Martin Luther

Thesis: Regardless of its shame, gore, and disgrace, the cross of Christ is the means of our salvation.
