Elder: How is the word of God to be preached by those that are called thereunto?

Congregation: They that are called to labor in the ministry of the word, are to preach sound doctrine, diligently, in season and out of season; plainly, not in the enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit, and of power; faithfully, making known the whole counsel of God; wisely, applying themselves to the necessities and capacities of the hearers; zealously, with fervent love to God and the souls of his people; sincerely, aiming at his glory, and their conversion, edification, and salvation.

Elder: What is required of those that hear the word preached?

Congregation: It is required of those that hear the word preached, that they attend upon it with diligence, preparation, and prayer; examine: What they hear by the scriptures; receive the truth with faith, love, meekness, and readiness of mind, as the word of God; meditate, and confer of it; hide it in their hearts, and bring forth the fruit of it in their lives.

Elder: For "Whoever will call on the name of the Lord will be saved."

Congregation: How then will they call on Him in whom they have not believed? How will they believe in Him whom they have not heard? And how will they hear without a preacher?

Elder: How will they preach unless they are sent? Just as it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news of good things!"

Congregation: However, they did not all heed the good news; for Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed our report?"

Elder: So faith *comes* from hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ.

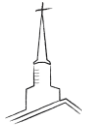

Introduction: How do we live in such an evil time in the world?
