Exciting news from our Berlin church plant – when we first recruited Michael Strub to be our national pastor for the church plant in Berlin, we had 2030 people who attended. Currently 45-50 people come regularly, and the weekend retreat in January had 65 participants!

Our weekly Parent-Child Café had 30 –people from the neighborhood who participated in January.

Lyn and I returned to Berlin in January for several days of meetings with our team, to sketch out our exit strategy for phasing out our church planting work by Dec 2011. Lord willing, the church I plant will be fully organized and self-sufficient, except for partial funding for the national pastor which will continue until 2014 on a reducing basis each year. How exciting to be passing the baton to national leadership!

Confessing the Faith The Creed of Chalcedon (A.D. 451)

Therefore, following the holy fathers, we all with one accord teach men to acknowledge one and the same Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, at once complete in Godhead and complete in manhood, truly God and truly man, consisting also of a reasonable soul and body; of one substance with the Father as regards his Godhead, and at the same time of one substance with us as regards his manhood; like us in all respects, apart from sin; as regards his Godhead, begotten of the Father before the ages, but yet as regards his manhood begotten, for us men and for our salvation, of Mary the Virgin, the God-bearer; one and the same Christ, Son, Lord, Only-begotten, recognized in two natures, without confusion, without change, without division, without separation; the distinction of natures being in no way annulled by the union, but rather the characteristics of each nature being preserved and coming together to form one person and subsistence, not as parted or separated into two persons, but one and the same Son and Only-begotten God the Word, Lord Jesus Christ; even as the prophets from earliest times spoke of him, and our Lord Jesus Christ himself taught us, and the creed of the fathers has handed down to us.

The Creed of Chalcedon is that Christ is true God and true man united in one person, the person of the Son of God in the Trinity. It therefore answers the question, who is Jesus Christ, with precision.
